#### **Drug Court Now Open**

#### **Program Aims to Rehab Addicts**

Waupaca County Drug Court is not a get-out-of-jail-free card. The five-phase program takes at least 14 months to complete and offenders must commit to a rigorous schedule and extensive monitoring.

In the first phase of the program, participants are randomly tested for drugs up to four times each week, meet with group counseling sessions every day, meet with the drug court coordinator two times a week, meet with their probation officer once per week, work with a recovery coach weekly and go before a judge for a progress evaluation once every week. Drug court began working with its first offenders in November 2017. Currently, there are five active participants in the program.

Judge Clussman will be speaking at our luncheon about Drug Court; what is it, how it works, etc. With the opioid epidemic as a focus of our Health Education agenda this year, this topic should be interesting as well as timely.

#### **News From the Volunteer Desk**

A new state- of- the- art PET/CT scanner was installed early 2018 at ThedaCare Regional Cancer Center.

It is currently improving patient diagnostics, helping to catch malignant tumors earlier, because of the fully digital capabilities. It improves scanning speed which is important for the patients comfort as scans can be shorter. It also reduces the amount of radiation needed to make an accurate diagnosis. The equipment is more sensitive and allows physicians to not only see the tumors with less radiation, but it also allows therm to see smaller tumors, giving the ability to diagnose cancers earlier.

This new PET/CT scanner is the only one like it in the nation. They had been working on bringing this scanner into the system for the past two years. Early diagnosis can help physicians deliver the right treatment at the right time improving the emotional health of patients during a challenging time.
